


Ebbinghaus's Forgetting Curve





A look on Maria Montessori

"In nowadays education there is a prejudice: the teacher should offer the child an object to get him to know its qualities in term of colours, surface and shape. However if objects are too many to be categorized, qualities are unlimited in number. Qualities can be compared to the alphabet: few sounds and uncountable words. Considering qualities separated one from the other means giving the alphabet, the tool, for discovery: a key to open the world of knowledge. The one who has classified qualities, and experienced the nuances of each quality, can really understand the environment and the nature of each and every single thing"
