

WHERE WE ARE IN LATVIA





The «bottleneck» of existing prevention and social support system for families and children at risk in municipalities:

- Limited financial and human resources from municipalities to offer services for families – thus acting mainly as distributor of material support
- Just formal support system for families
- Unsufficient interinstitutional cooperation
- Social services is autonomous function of municipalities without additional financial support from state and without requirements for minimum support services





> Child observation form for teachers

Research based methodology for pedagogues of kindergarten to start discussion with parents and/or colleagues, not to hide but solve cases.

To create good practice for future preventive work at school – to trust, talk and solve!

- **27.05.2014.** Riga City Council regulation Nr. 110 "About delegation of social work with families and children in project «Riga family support program»


Including permittion to use social work database of municipalities SOPA:

- 5.11.2014. agreement nr. TC-14-264-lī/ 2-10/13A between SOS Latvia and Riga Municipality for use of SOPA database
 - Riga SOS Family support centre as officially registered social service provider has relieved work of 6 Riga Social Service territorial centres, since Jan 2014 has provided services for 150 families with ~300 children.






HOW OUR SOCIAL WORK IS ORGANISED

INNO-Program for work with teenagers

- To reduce the continuation of negative experience in future generations: violence, abandonment, neglect, poor social skills, traumatized personality. Teenagers as a specific target audience, therefor:
 - Various forms of activities with teenagers and their families piloted in the project;
 - Till end of year a program for children and teenagers (10-14yo) is prepared and will be tested - partially «gender specific» men - boys; women - girls (up to 9 days);
 - Till end of year outreach program for teenagers and their families developed, learning from institutional rehabilitation program set up by the NGO «Allazhi child and family support center" for abused children and youngsters together with family;
 - Burning issue: Ministry of Justice is developing new "Children's antisocial behavior prevention law" to replace existing article nr. 58 of Child Protection Law









- Unique programme in Latvia
- In partnership with municipalities plus local donation
- More than 45 children in list for help 2016
- Therapeutical camp 25 children, 7 specialists and 2 volunteers

Necessity:

- to be available as a **full-year programme**, possibility to provide individual professional support to parents and children closer to their place of living when tragedy happens;
- professional support to parents and children in regions
- advocasy measures for this specific support to be available as municipality or state service in future

Grant period: 01.01.2014 - 31.12.2016 (36 months)

Overall goal of the project: to prevent children from abuse and neglect and to reduce the risks of their social exclusion.

To fulfill the target, the project activities will be carried out on 3 levels:

Micro level \rightarrow to build capacity within vulnerable families to prevent them from falling apart and abandoning their children;

Mezo level \rightarrow to build up capacity and to foster cross-sectorial cooperation of **professionals of social work**, working with children and families and to improve existing support and prevention system for vulnerable children;

Macro level \rightarrow to foster cooperation between the relevant NGO's & public stakeholders to reach improvement of the policy framework & quality and accessibility of services for children & families, helping to prevent children from neglect and abuse
