Rasa Jansone



Pasa Jansone (1973) is a contemporary artist - obtained the degree of Master of Arts in painting at The Art Academy of Latiia in 2002. Jansone mainly works in painting and has participated in numerous group exhibitions in Latiia, Germany, Tainan as well as takes part in site-specific and environmental art projects (the Open-Air Museum in Pedvale, Roja Paku symposium, Riga city environment within the "Days of Art"). This portrait is from the family series of the exhibition "Nourishing Mist" held in the Intro Hall of the Riga Art Space in 2014, in which mothers were immortalized. It is painted in an expressive way on the faces of the artist's acquaintances, girlfriends, and their offspring, reminding us that there are no indifferent people in this topic.

It is a crown that seems to show the cycle of life, the cycle of the year. I imagine that by tracing the fate of an apple tree over the course of one year, we see the philosophy of the rhythm of life. We see how it is both in the life of an apple, where of course it happens faster, and ultimately also in the life of a person." Imants Lancmanis (1941) graduated from the Painting Department of the Lativan Academy of Arts in 1966. Find all your equipment 2. Fold 9 sheets that are added together 3 and 3, i.e. 3 "inserts" 3. Make cover with stuff 4. Make holes in the backs of the sheets 5. Sew together with about 1 m. strong and thin thread

Juris Justs



Juris Justs - street photographer, Riga. @riga_street_photography - a unique street photography project "Latria is in my eyes a grey country - therefor I choose black and white photographies in my caption of everyday life in the streets of Riga. There is a lot of structure and drama - I try to capture this. My street photographies are photos of and for local people, not for foreigners. I observer places everybody knows in Riga, the surroundings in the streets. Not the parcs. It is maybe dirty. Like a second life. Social landscape. Not staged photos. I do not ask them. One, two or three shots of the motif. From the stomach level (my work position) My neighborhood. The market. The goal is to capture what interest me.

look around you Try to capture a motif of reality, everyday life on the streets. Kids riding bicycle or playing games.

Do the people in the street convey any interests, what are day? Think about the light, shadows ... are the people in a hurry?

It helps a lot if you are motivated for the task. You feel the need to capture a specific mood. Do not try to be artistic, or to make art. Street photography aims to capture reality.

















Lister to "Juras gramata" by the Latrian contemporary composer Raimonds Tiguls (1972). It is a contemporary piece of music that capturates listeners with its blend of classical and folk elements. The music takes its inspiration from the beauty and mystique of the sea. Start with a warm-up, visually expressing emotions on a sheet of paper, while reacting to the music. 2. On a long paper-roll hanging on the wall, interpret different moods of music, expressing notions of horizon/ landscape, brightlight, water drops, angry and sad, etc. 3. The next exercise is to perform on two very large sheets of paper on the floor. Using circular movements, create floral and mandala-inspired compositions. 4. Finish off by drawing outlines of the bodies on another paper roll hung on the wall.

Ask yourself: does a person have edges? -where does your self end and where does the other person start? -show each other your boundaries. Does time has a face? -describe yourselves to each other





Be a sounddetective and hunt for objects that can make sound

Discover what the sound can be like, alone and in connection with other found objects. Once you have sound, start the process of putting

Arturs Analts



Arturs Analts (1991) is a contemporary artist from Riga educated from Riga Art and Design Secondary School and Central Saint Martins College of Arts and Design in London. Arthur Analts' interactive installation "Matter to Matter" was the Latvian contribution to London Design Biennale 2018. It represented Latvia's relationship to its natural environment using such materials as wood and water. It was inspired by Arthur Analts' native city of Riga. Due to its proximity to the Baltic Sea,

Riga has its own unique climate, with a constant humidity that often leads to condensation.

The installation invited visitors to leave their own message or print and, after a couple of minutes, the temporal marks naturally disappear. Through this process Analts asks us to consider the power of nature and highlights the role of designers and architects as the creators of a responsible, sustainable future where nature and its inhabitants coexist. It is a statement about culture and transience, of secret messages, and the ways in which nature can over over human traces.

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About the project Artlab in a Suitcase

Artlab in a Suitcase is a pilot art project filled with contemporary art experiences for kids and youths. It was initially developed for internal and limited use throughout the EEA grant programmes project "Culture Plant» No. EEZ/2022/2/18 funded by Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway through the EEA. This printed publication, the activity book, is thus just one part of the pilot project.

We decided at an early stage to develop this specific pilot project for Jelgava Local Municipality and we challenged the participating teachers, librarians, and cultural workers to take part. The main theme, since start, has been to improve access to professional contemporary art for children and youngsters in Jelgava Local Municipality, to promote and increase their involvement in creation of new contemporary art and cultural products.

In our work with contemporary art, we focus on an artform which is less bound to the formal aesthetic criteria of art. Contemporary art is more connected to ideas and content than technique and shape. It is often an action or an arena for social conversation, and this is a great starting point for a dialogue-based dissemination to children and youngsters. The experiences are aesthetic and sensory, and they often tell stories and give us a possibility to reflect and philosophize. Both in big and small questions. We build skills in talking about art and combine this with fun activities.

"Artlab in a Suitcase" is a portfolio-case filled with 7 different Latvian contemporary art experiences; 5 printed replicas, one book and one contemporary piece of music. Together, we have created an environment the kids/youths/students can step into, and they will be activated physically and intellectually. The kids/youths/students are invited to experience the artworks and reflect in connection with their own skills and experiences. A joint conversation/dialogue with fun activities.

Dialogue based dissemination

Dialogue based dissemination should be built up with both conversation and reflection in mind. The adults take care of the input along the way. The communication is adapted to the young participants' grade level. Let them define the direction of the conversation. These art experiences trigger engagement, creativity, and the desire to explore. The senses are activated, from smelling the materials to feeling the different textures. Experiences that offer physical responses. It is vital that everybody listen to each other's experiences and ideas.

We practice visual thinking – a guide to work with contemporary art that opens the dialogue. We build language and listening skills to create the environment for relaxed thinking, to focus on what does it look like before you have an answer and to value each other's contribution to the talk, an open mind. It is based on asking three questions:

- 1. What is going on in this artwork?
- 2. What do you see that makes you say that?
- 3. What more can we find?

What are we thinking looking at art, and how can we find out? In visual thinking we use transition words; above, between, before, after and we focus on what everybody does well (not focus on right and wrong). It is a process to build the understanding of aesthetic development and the messy parts of generating ideas both in making art and in making sense of the art and the world.

We dive into aspects of cognition. From the objective understanding to subjective understanding. We talk about personal association, questioning, speculating, analysing and factfinding.

Storytelling

The theme for this specific pilot suitcase and the joint theme for these seven artworks is storytelling. How do artists tell stories through their art and expression? The different artworks build awareness of how stories can be told visually and how artists use colour, line, gesture, composition, and symbolism to tell a story. The dialogue-based dissemination with activities challenges kids/youths/students to interpret and create narratives.

The artworks in the suitcase are supplemented with this activity-book and support-material for mediators (teachers/cultural workers/librarians) Thus based upon a work of art they can apply what they learn to create works of art that tell a story.

We chose the different artists and artworks based on a pitch session where the participants from Jelgava Local Municipality suggested different Latvian contemporary artists and artworks related to the theme. The diversity of media and materials represents different ways to work with contemporary art and storytelling as a theme. The wide scope gives the participants multiple ways of working with the suitcase and available materials at the different arenas (school, culture house, library...).

As mentioned, the project was initially developed for internal and limited use. This printed publication, the activity book, is thus just one part of the pilot project and suggests interesting possibilities in the dissemination of contemporary art to a young audience. There could be many more different themes, different artworks, and content-rich activities.
